Sustainability Report 2023





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UIU is convinced that inclusive Economic Development is key to provide sustainable jobs and promote equality. Our employment policy ensures equitable opportunities and benefits for the employees that contribute to addressing poverty. Our scholarship policy ensures financial support for all students, regardless of gender or financial background, providing scope for higher education.

Our interdisciplinary research activities contribute in augmenting knowledge about approaches to poverty alleviation, which makes impacts on policy processes of poverty reduction. In the year of 2023, out of 7,224 registered students, 3,511 students from the low-income families received financial aids.





Accessibility and Financial Support

United International University is the highest tuition fees waiver provider among all universities in Bangladesh. Every trimester, 15% of the top students in each class are automatically counted for 100% scholarships that help them get a free education without paying any tuition fees. This year 2022, a nominated student from an NGO called “Happy Home” got a 50% waiver on tuition fees to continue her educational journey with United International University.

Scholarships and Waivers

Scholarships and financial aid are received by over **75% of students** annually.

Additional **assistantship opportunities** are provided by UIU. These programs allow students to earn and support their academic expenses.

- **100% Scholarships** available for students recommended by embassies from countries such as India, Nepal, Bhutan, Sri Lanka, Maldives, Palestine, and Turkey.
- The international student community includes students from Somalia, Kenya, Djibouti, Palestine, Nigeria, and Bhutan.



Affordable Services

Subsidized Transportation

The university offers a free shuttle service with five buses operating on the route, completing 112 round trips daily to the nearest transportation hub. Each bus can accommodate up to 40 students per trip. If students were to use local transportation for the same purpose, they would incur a cost of at least 60 Tk for a round trip each day. This results in a total daily subsidy of approximately 134,400 Tk provided by the university through the shuttle service.

Highly subsidized transportation services are provided to low-income students.

Long Route Transportation Service

Approximately 12% of the total students annually use UIU's long-route transportation service, paying only 1,000 Tk per month. This amount covers just 25% of the monthly cost compared to public transportation. Thus, United International University provides a 75% subsidy on transportation, ensuring students can continue their studies without financial strain.

Affordable Meals

The university canteen offers meals at discounted rates, e.g., a chicken meal costs only **BDT 60**, nearly half the price of similar meals at outside restaurants.

Hostel Facilities

A standard home nearby the campus area costs around 7,000 TK for a student to stay for a month, while the dormitory facility provided by the United International University is almost 25% less than that. This gap is filled by the university authority as a subsidy to promote educational equality regardless of income group.

UIU offers separate, well-managed male and female hostels with fees that are **affordable and competitive** relative to the services provided.

MarketBrain: A Neuromarketing System for Advanced Marketing Research


Neuromarketing, a Brain Computer Interface (BCI) based marketing research approach, uses brain signal recordings to analyze and predict consumer response to the marketing stimuli.

In developed countries, Neuromarketing is being vastly explored in academic research and it is successful running as industrial platforms as an alternative to traditional market evaluation techniques.

Traditional survey methods may provide unreliable consumer information due to indiscriminate self-reporting and time constraints. We are proposing to build the very first local Neuromarketing platform in Bangladesh by utilizing BCI and adapting industry 4.0 technologies.

Our intelligent system will identify consumer engagement with the advertisements based on consumers' cognitive and emotional responses measured from neural and physiological signal.

This platform will provide our local businesses cost efficient customized solution and will make our footprint in the world.





DEEP-DEPRESSION: Feasibility to Design and Development of Brain Computer Interface (BCI) Based System for Identifying Depression using Neural Connectivity Analysis of Human Brain

Deep-depression is Brain Computer Interface (BCI) based research approach that can help us to identify the biomarkers of healthy and depressed human brains.

Depression is a common and serious medical illness which affects negatively on our mood. According to global success academy, everyday almost 3000 suicide cases and about 60,000 cases have been found those may attempt to end their lives. It has been found that about 35.8% suicide is occurred due to depression.

According to global health estimation, 4.1% of the population in Bangladesh is suffering from depression. This ratio has been further increased due to COVID-19 and the main reasons behind this scenario are Stress from losing job, financial crisis, losing friends or family members.

Until now, for diagnostic purposes, psychiatrists chose different clinical questionnaire based assessments and observed the patient behavior to identify the presence of depression within the patients. However, this process is dependent mostly on the answers provided by the patients. On the other hand, the human brain cannot lie to us. So, along with the conventional techniques, BCI technology can be used to identify depression through analyzing brain signals.

According to the best of our knowledge, we are the first in Bangladesh going to develop this assistive technology. In the near future, this supervised model will help to quickly diagnose mental illness as well as become a helpful tool for the psychological farms which can create a foresight for the future generation in the field of psychology as well as neuroscience.





Bolte Chai

In order to ensure that everyone may express their preferences, the founder and Director of AIMS Lab, Prof. Khondaker Abdullah Al Mamun, PhD investigated and created a solution for people who are unable to speak.

He created a smartphone-based app in accordance with their needs. '**Bolte Chai**' is an Android mobile application developed for verbally challenged ASD children.

Considering the customization capability, the android application is divisible into two different modes. This Project is funded by the Information and Communication Technology Division (ICTD), in collaboration with AIMS Lab, UIU, Neuro-Developmental Disability Protection Trust (NDDP Trust), the Ministry of Social Welfare of the government of Bangladesh & Tauri Foundation (MoU).

The innovation Bolte Chai is an augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) tool incorporated in a mobile application, which is available in both android and iOS systems.

The application utilizes the picture exchange communication technique for speech-impaired people to communicate with others.

While pressing to a specific image, there generates sound which expresses the desires of the user. All the pictures and sounds can be personalized as per the need of the user.

A single tap SMS-based system is available in this application for assisting to seek help in case of any emergency situation for the users. All these features are already available in the current version of the app.

Virtual Eye Test

Bangladesh is one of the most densely populated countries in the world, where a significant number of populations are suffering eye health and visionary problems. Over the last decade, a rapid growth of ICT uses has shown in Bangladesh. Thus ICT based health services would be an effective solution for providing the better health services to the citizens of Bangladesh.

In this research work, an android based mobile application (Virtual Eye Doc) is developed in Bengali language to support the citizens of Bangladesh for their eye health monitoring and vision examination.

The paper highlights our experiences of designing and developing the Virtual Eye Doc application. This paper also presents a qualitative and quantitative exploration of the effectiveness and the perceived benefits of this app, and suggestions for improvement of this app.





Smart Autism Barta

If autism can be identified at an early stage, it can be said for sure that children with autism will not be a burden to the society; they can also play a vital role in various activities in the society.

'Smart Autism Barta' is a mobile-based, interactive, community-based screening tool used to diagnose and monitor autism.

Parents, physicians, trained health professionals can use this app and website to learn about autism screening and what to do next. By screening parents of autistic children in rural areas, this app can refer them to the closest hospital.

AIMS Lab, UIU, conducted a study and developed this screening questionnaire to identify autistic children in the early stage. Smart Autism barta is a a2i funded project. A MoU is signed between AIMS Lab, UIU and Neuro Developmental Disability Protection Trust (NDDP Trust) of The Ministry of Social Welfare of the government of Bangladesh.

The AIMS lab has signed MoU with Neuro Developmental Disability Protection Trust (NDDP Trust) and Tauri Foundation to work with the community in this regard. Also, several other innovations regarding tools for disease screening brain computer interaction for identifying depression and suicidal biomarkers using neural connectivity analysis of human brain has been developed. These along with the innovations from CMED health which is a startup supported by UIU works directly into the community for quality life and well-being.





Centre for Biomedical Science and Engineering (CBMSE)

The CBMSE and Alo Bhubon Trust (BT) jointly organize an accredited online e-learning program for developing cancer professionals for the updated technology (Therapy and diagnostic) used for cancer treatment.

In this way UIU and Alo BT are working for patient health benefits specially for cancer patients for South Asia including Bangladesh. These ELPs usually cover all the branches of Medical Physics aiming to improve the quality of cancer care and eliminate cancer in the South Asia region.

Most of these programs are attended by local and international participants (300+ participants from 22+ countries) and accredited by IOMP (International Organization for Medical Physics) and EBAMP (European Board for Accreditation for Medical Physics) respectively.



Shared Sports Facilities

UIU has a **large field** which accommodates two football playgrounds at the same time. We share our field with local schools, colleges and universities as well as the **local community** on a necessity basis.

Government and national level programs are also held at the large green field which accommodates the participants from all over the society with free access.

UIU has **gymnasium facilities** which are shared by students and employees.



Affordable and Clean Energy

UIU is fully aware and convinced that energy is central to sustainable development, which is the major challenge of the moment.

Our university follows the directives from the “Energy Efficiency and Conservation Master Plan” of the government. In order to reduce energy consumption for air cooling.

Our university building is designed keeping a large percentage of areas open to allow enough natural light and natural air flow to keep the campus naturally bright and cool.

We ensure reduction of energy consumption through replacing the less efficient appliances by more efficient ones, e.g., replacing the non-LED lights or computer monitors by LED based appliances. Second is by conservation of energy by reducing pilferage.

Most of our energy consumption (~75%) comes from air conditioners and attendants are assigned to make sure that the air conditioners are switched off when the rooms are not in use. We are already using automated switching off mechanisms using IoT in some places.

Our university is one of the leading institutions involved in the research and promotion of renewable energy in the country.

Our Centre for Energy Research (CER) offers courses on renewable energy technologies and provides consultancy services to the public and private sector.

We are also involved in energy auditing of interested industrial or commercial installations and in design and implementation of large scale rooftop solar etc.

We have designed more than 70% of the solar mini grid facilities established in Bangladesh. We have already implemented the 128KW solar panel in the University rooftop to generate electricity for us.



United International University (UIU) is committed to sustainable energy practices and aligns its policies with the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Master Plan of Bangladesh's Power Division. Key initiatives include:

Energy Efficiency Measures

Adoption of energy-efficient appliances such as **LED lights and monitors**.

Conservation efforts through **reducing energy pilferage, assigning attendants, and implementing IoT-based automated switching systems**.

Plans to introduce smart systems and sub metering for detailed energy consumption analysis.

Renewable Energy Adoption

A **128KW rooftop solar PV system** is operational, with plans for further expansion to cover all campus buildings.

Focus on reducing reliance on carbon-intensive energy sources like coal and oil.

Research and Education in Renewable Energy

The **Center for Energy Research (CER)** offers courses on renewable energy technologies and consulting services to public and private sectors.

Involvement in designing and implementing more than 50% of Bangladesh's solar mini-grids.

Policy and Advisory Contributions

Faculty members collaborate with government bodies to shape renewable energy policies, including net metering, smart grids, and clean cooking technologies.

Advisory services are provided to renewable energy-based startups and low-carbon initiatives.

Commitment to Divestment and Industry Support

UIU actively supports divestment from fossil fuels while fostering education, research, and consultancy in renewable energy and low-carbon solutions.



These initiatives highlight UIU's leadership in promoting sustainable energy practices and supporting the transition to a low-carbon future.

The Centre for Energy Research (CER) at United International University (UIU), under the Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (EEE), is at the forefront of innovation in renewable energy and sustainability.

Research and Innovation

Focus areas include renewable energy, green technologies, and environmental sustainability.

Developed a **World Bank-funded Renewable Energy Research Laboratory** for advanced research.

Key projects include designing **low-cost, high-efficiency circuits for solar and electrical appliances, micro controller-based solar charge controllers with maximum power point tracking, smart AMI meters for distribution systems, and smart solar irrigation systems.**

Conducted technical audits of Solar Home Systems (SHSs) installed across Bangladesh under IDCOL programs in 2008 and 2011.

International Conferences

Hosts the biennial **International Conference on the Developments in Renewable Energy Technology (ICDRET)**, with six successful events held between 2009 and 2021.

The conferences attract national and international participants and have been co-organized and supported by institutions such as:

Additional benefits include medical and conveyance allowances, maternity leave with pay, provident funds, and gratuity as retirement benefits.

Overtime payments are provided for extra hours worked by support staff, including attendants, drivers, and supervisors.

Gender Equity and Non-Discrimination

UIU enforces a pay scale equity policy to eliminate gender pay gaps and ensure promotions and increments follow the Employee Service Rule.

The Proctorial Committee enforces anti-discrimination and anti-harassment measures.


Mentoring and Support Programs

Collaboration with NGOs : Reconstruction of Shabolombe Gram

The Institute of Development Studies and Sustainability (IDSS) at United International University (UIU) is actively collaborating with the leading NGO Ananya Shoothing Team (UST) to support disadvantaged communities. Demonstrating a strong commitment to social equity, IDSS focuses on enhancing the lives and livelihoods of marginalized populations.

Currently, IDSS is working on innovative approaches to microcredit and strategies for building resilience to uncertainties in a rapidly changing world. As part of these efforts, IDSS has initiated the formation of small community associations in various villages of the Nilphamari District, located in Northern Bangladesh.

These initiatives aim to empower local communities, improve socio-economic conditions, and foster sustainable development in line with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



Collaboration with NGOs :Smart Autism Barta

The Advanced Intelligent Multidisciplinary Systems Lab (AIMS Lab) at United International University (UIU) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Neuro-Developmental Disability Protection (NDDP) Trust and the Tauri Foundation to develop innovative solutions for supporting children with autism and neuro-developmental disabilities (NDD).

As part of this collaboration, AIMS Lab is leading the development of two groundbreaking projects:

"Bolte Chai" – A digital communication platform designed specifically for non-verbal autistic and NDD children.

"Smart Autism Barta" – A mobile-based, interactive, and community-driven screening tool to diagnose and monitor autism.

The NDDP Trust will provide support for deploying these tools, while AIMS Lab focuses on their development. The implementation and service delivery will be handled by NDDP Trust, ensuring that the tools reach the intended beneficiaries.

The feasibility analysis for these projects was carried out in partnership with AIMS Lab, Tauri Foundation, and NDDP Trust under the guidance of the Ministry of Social Welfare, Government of Bangladesh. The project is being executed in alignment with the narrative and financial proposals jointly submitted by the stakeholders.



Collaboration with NGOs : Education for the SDGs SCMPCR e-learning program (ELP) for Medical Physicists

Cancer remains the second leading cause of death globally, with Bangladesh reporting 13 to 15 lakh cancer patients and approximately two lakh new cases annually. The rising incidence of cancer in Bangladesh, fueled by factors such as contaminated food, sedentary lifestyles, and hereditary factors, underscores the urgent need for enhanced cancer care and awareness.

To address this challenge, the Centre for Biomedical Science and Engineering (CBMSE) at United International University (UIU), in collaboration with the Alo Bhubon Trust, conducts accredited online e-learning programs aimed at developing skilled cancer professionals. These programs provide training on the latest advancements in cancer therapy and diagnostics, focusing on improving cancer care quality and working toward the elimination of cancer in South Asia.

This year, CBMSE, UIU, in collaboration with SCMPCR, delivered a series of accredited programs, certified by the International Organization for Medical Physics (IOMP) and the European Board for Accreditation for Medical Physics (EBAMP). These initiatives highlight UIU's commitment to building professional capacity in the fight against cancer, aligning with the goals of SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being and fostering regional collaboration for sustainable healthcare solutions.
